Coin "Alexandria lighthouse". 2nd century AD. Bronze, diam. 3,5 cm. Morlanwelz, Royal Museum of Mariemont. $^{\circ}$ Royal Museum of Mariemont.

This bronze coin, kept in the Royal Museum of Mariemont, dates from the 2nd century AD and measures 3.5 cm in diameter. In its centre we can see the engraved Lighthouse of Alexandria. Between East and West, Alexandria has often been considered as an ideal city. A commercial metropolis of the Eastern Mediterranean and a centre of universal knowledge, it is the cradle of major scientific discoveries and artistic productions.
